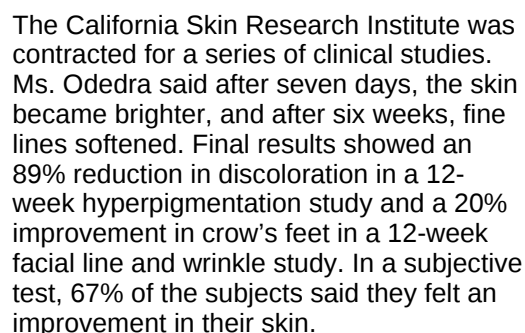
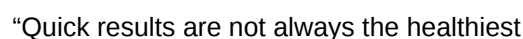

A Charming Solution

Mikuni’s new Charme skin care line uses a similar spray system, but is accompanied by a low pH solution of sodium chloride and water to relieve skin care problems such as dry skin, eczema, acne, bed sores, sunburn and diaper rash. The solution can be used as both an astringent and cleanser, executives said. Research has shown the antimicrobial effects of low pH water against E-coli, Staphylococcus aureus, Salmonella, Psuedomonas aeruginosa and others.

Specifically, the water is electrolyzed into acidic and alkaline particles, 40 microns or less in diameter, in the Charme system.

“Charme has the same number of negative ions equivalent to standing under a waterfall in the rain forest,” Ms. Odedra said.

The products are distributed to select spas and salons through ActSys Healthcare, such as the Gita Gabriel spa in New York City.
